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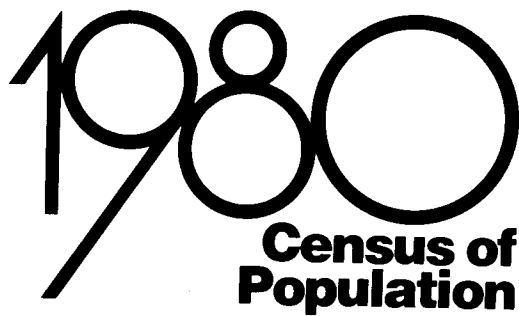


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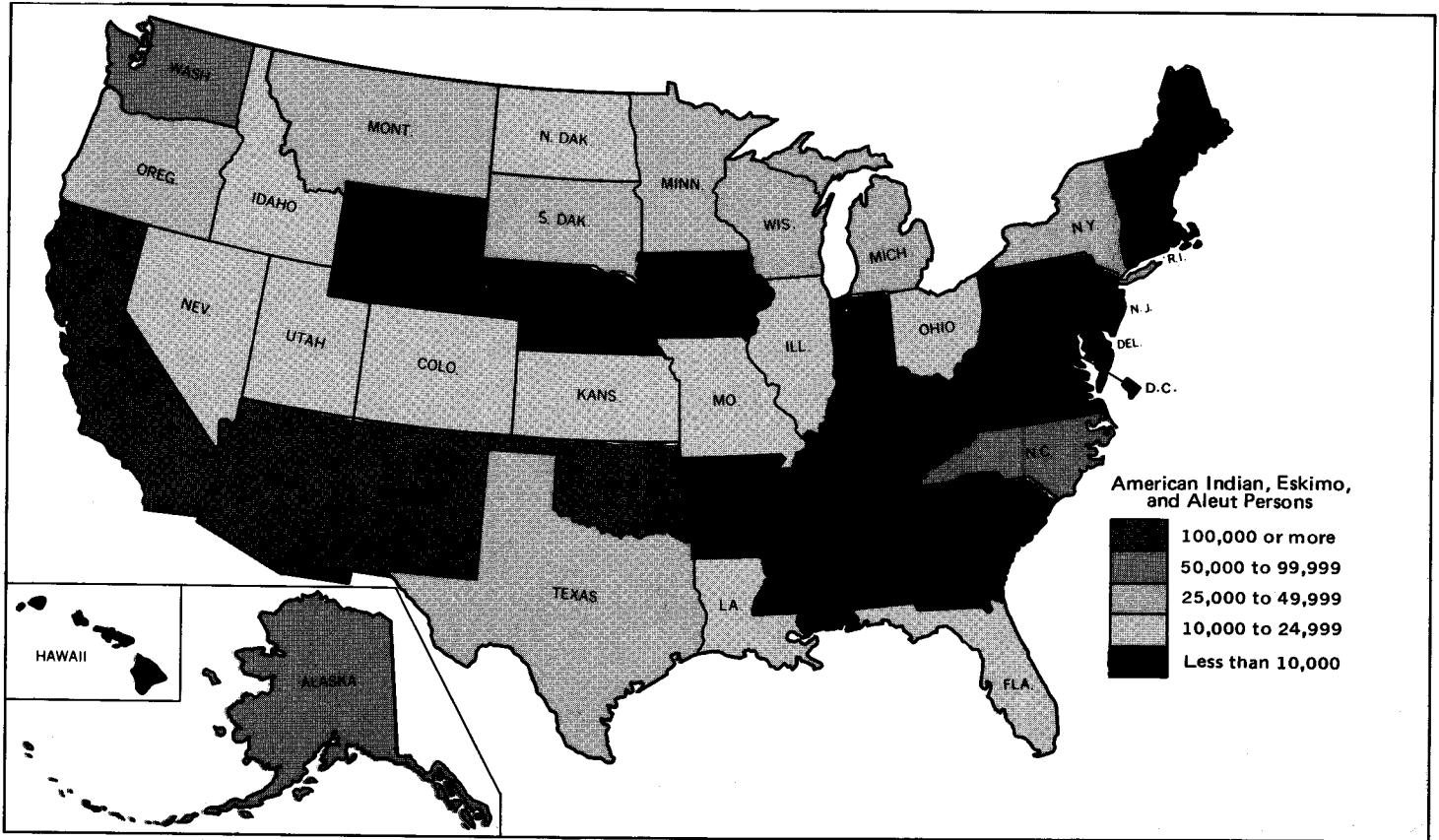
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Number of American Indian, Eskimo, and Aleut Persons by State: 1980



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NOTE: This is a prepublication version of the forthcoming 1980 census supplementary report, *American Indian Areas and Alaska Native Villages: 1980*, PC80-S1-13. This document contains a condensed version of the final supplementary report. The final report which is expected to be published early in 1984 will provide more tables and a more complete description and explanation of the data.

Introduction

GENERAL

This report presents 1980 census counts of the total and American Indian population for American Indian areas which include reservations, tribal trust lands (off reservation), and the historic areas of Oklahoma (excluding urbanized areas). Counts are shown for the total, American Indian, Eskimo, and Aleut populations in Alaska Native villages and Alaska Native regional corporations. Summaries are provided for the United States, regions, divisions, and States. The report contains information on the number of occupied housing units (or households) with an American Indian householder or spouse; in Alaska, comparable data are presented for households with an American Indian, Eskimo, and Aleut householder or spouse.

The types of American Indian and Alaska Native areas recognized in the 1980 census were based on recommendations of the Office of Management and Budget Task Force on Indian Census and consultations with American Indian tribal governments and organizations, and State governments. The 1980 census is the first decennial census to identify all Federal and State American Indian reservations and the other American Indian and Alaska Native areas shown in this report. (In 1970, 115 reservations were identified for the census.) This is the first 1980 census report to present data on tribal trust lands, the historic areas of Oklahoma (excluding urbanized areas), and Alaska Native regional corporations.

The 1980 census counts of the total population and American Indians, Eskimos, and Aleuts for the United States and each region, division, and State are presented in table 1. Table 2 shows the American Indian population living on and off reservations or tribal trust lands for the United States, regions, divisions, and States. The 1980 population and housing unit counts for all races and American

Indians are presented for reservations and tribal trust lands in table 3. Distributions of the American Indian population on reservations and tribal trust lands by State and county or census area are presented in table 4. Comparable data to the information shown in tables 3 and 4 are provided in table 5 for the historic areas of Oklahoma (excluding urbanized areas) by county and in tables 6 and 7 for Alaska Native villages. Table 8 presents counts of the American Indian, Eskimo, and Aleut population in Alaska Native villages by Alaska Native regional corporations.

DISTRIBUTION OF THE AMERICAN INDIAN, ESKIMO, AND ALEUT POPULATIONS BY REGION AND STATE

American Indians

The American Indian population exceeded 1 million (1,366,678) in 1980 and showed an increase of about 574,000 persons or 72 percent over the decade. The substantially larger 1980 census count is the result of natural increase and overall improvements in census procedures, including modified enumeration procedures on American Indian reservations and the use of self-identification to obtain the race of respondents in all areas of the country. Also, a preliminary evaluation of the census results suggests that there may have been a greater frequency in 1980 than in 1970 for individuals, especially those of mixed Indian and non-Indian descent, to report their race as American Indian.

In 1980, as in 1970, approximately one-half of the American Indian population lived in the West. In 1980, 27 percent of American Indians lived in the South, 18 percent in the North Central, and 6 percent in the Northeast. The South was the only region to show a noticeable increase in the proportion of

American Indians, from 25 percent in 1970 to 27 percent in 1980.

The States with an American Indian population of 100,000 or more in 1980 were California (198,275), Oklahoma (169,292), Arizona (152,498), and New Mexico (107,340). Approximately 46 percent of the American Indian population lived in these four States; 10 other States had a substantial American Indian population (over 25,000) ranging from Oregon (26,591) to North Carolina (64,536). These 10 States were located in each of the four regions.

Of the four States with the largest American Indian population, California registered the largest percent increase during the 1970-1980 decade (more than doubling its population), and it substantially increased its share of the total American Indian population from 11 percent in 1970 to 15 percent in 1980. Oklahoma had the second largest increase in the American Indian population (tables A and 1).

Eskimos and Aleuts

The 1980 census showed that the Eskimo (42,162) and Aleut (14,205) populations were still highly concentrated in Alaska. Eighty-one percent, or 34,144, of the Eskimo and 57 percent, or 8,090, of the Aleuts were in Alaska. The only other States with more than 2,500 Eskimos and Aleuts were California, with 1,734 Eskimos and 1,480 Aleuts, and Washington, with 1,253 Eskimos and 1,365 Aleuts (table 1).

DISTRIBUTION OF AMERICAN INDIANS ON RESERVATIONS, TRIBAL TRUST LANDS, AND HISTORIC AREAS OF OKLAHOMA (EXCLUDING URBANIZED AREAS)

About 36 percent of the total American Indian population lived in American

Indian areas and Alaska Native villages in 1980. (See "Definitions and Explanations" section for definitions of American Indian areas.) The proportion of American Indians residing in these identified areas varied substantially by region. The West had the highest proportion (42 percent) of the American Indian population in American Indian areas and Alaska Native villages. Approximately 36 percent of American Indians in the South lived in American Indian areas, 29 percent in the North Central, but only 10 percent in the Northeast.

In some States, American Indians were heavily concentrated in American Indian areas; over 70 percent in four States—

New Mexico (78 percent), Arizona (75 percent), South Dakota (74 percent), and Oklahoma (72 percent). An additional four States had between 50 and 65 percent of the American Indian population in American Indian areas—North Dakota, Montana, Wyoming, and Mississippi (tables C, 2, and 5).

American Indian Reservations

There were 278 Federal and State reservations identified for the 1980 census. The number of the reservations varied greatly by region, ranging from 192 reservations in the West to 16 in the South. The 1980

census showed that one-fourth (339,838) of all American Indians (1,366,678) lived on reservations. The American Indian population on reservations comprised about 49 percent of the total reservation population. The size of the American Indian population living on reservations varied substantially; however, most reservations had less than 1,000 American Indian persons. Only one reservation—Navajo—had more than 100,000 American Indians. Pine Ridge Reservation was the only other reservation with more than 10,000 American Indians. An additional eight reservations had more than 5,000 American Indians: Blackfeet, Fort Apache, Gila River, Hopi, Papago, Rosebud, San Carlos, and Zuni Pueblo.

Tribal Trust Lands

In 1980, 30,265 American Indians resided on tribal trust lands, representing 2 percent of the total American Indian population. The Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) identified 36 reservations with tribal trust lands and the Minnesota Chippewa Tribal Trust Lands for the 1980 census (table 3).

The Navajo Reservation had the largest number of American Indians on tribal trust lands, followed by Cheyenne River Reservation, Turtle Mountain Reservation, and Rosebud Reservation. American Indians comprised about 56 percent of the total population residing on tribal trust lands in 1980.

Historic Areas of Oklahoma (Excluding Urbanized Areas)

The historic areas of Oklahoma (excluding urbanized areas) consist of the former reservations which had legally established boundaries during the period 1900-1907.

The American Indian population in the historic areas of Oklahoma (excluding urbanized areas) numbered 116,359 in 1980, representing 9 percent of the total population in the area (table 5). The majority (69 percent) of American Indians in Oklahoma resided within the boundaries of the historic areas (excluding urbanized areas). (Another 3 percent of the American Indian population in Oklahoma resided on the Osage Reservation, the only reservation in the State.)

DISTRIBUTION OF ALASKA NATIVES IN ALASKA

In 1980, the total Alaska Native population living in Alaska numbered 64,103. The counts for each group were—21,869

American Indians, 34,144 Eskimos, and 8,090 Aleuts. Alaska Natives comprised 16 percent of the total population of the State (table 7).

About 63 percent of the total American Indian, Eskimo, and Aleut population

in the State lived on Annette Islands Reserve (the only reservation in Alaska) and in the Alaska Native villages. The proportion living on the reservation and in Alaska Native villages varied substantially by group—41 percent of American Indians, 78 percent of Eskimos, and 58 percent of Aleuts lived in these areas.

Of the 39,301 Alaska Natives living in the 209 Alaska Native villages, Eskimos were the largest group, 26,574, accounting for about 68 percent of the total Alaska Native population. About one-fifth, or 8,023, were American Indians and approximately 12 percent, or 4,704, were Aleuts (table 6).

Of the 209 Alaska Native villages, only 3—Barrow, Bethel, and Kotzebue—had more than 1,000 Alaska Natives. Seven villages which had between 500 and 1,000 Alaska Native residents were Dillingham, Emmonak, Hoonah, Hooper Bay, Mountain Village, Selawik, and Unalakleet.

Definitions and Explanations

PRINCIPAL SUBJECTS

Race—The data on race were derived from answers to question 4, which was asked of all persons. (See facsimile of the questionnaire item in this section.)

The concept of race as used by the Census Bureau reflects self-identification by respondents; it does not denote any clear-cut scientific definition of biological stock. Since the 1980 census obtained information on race through self-identification, the data represent self-classification by people according to the race with which they identify.

For persons who could not provide a single response to the race question, the race of the person's mother was used; however, if a single response could not be provided for the person's mother, the first race reported by the person was used. This is a modification of the 1970 census procedure in which the race of the person's father was used.

The categories "American Indian," "Eskimo," and "Aleut" include persons who classified themselves as such in one of the specific race categories. In addition, persons who did not report themselves in one of the specific race categories but entered the name of an American Indian tribe or reported entries such as Canadian Indian, French-American Indian, or Spanish-American Indian, were classified as American Indian.

American Indian Areas—In this report, the American Indian areas are defined as American Indian reservations, tribal trust lands located outside the reservation boundaries, and the historic areas of Oklahoma (excluding urbanized areas).

American Indian Reservations—American Indian reservations are areas with boundaries established by treaty, statute, and/or executive or court order. There were 278 American Indian reservations, and their boundaries were identified

for the 1980 census by the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) and State governments. The Federal and State reservations are located in 33 States and may cross State, county, minor civil division/census county division, and place boundaries. Three reservation areas are composed of lands that are jointly administered and/or claimed by two reservations—San Felipe/Santa Ana Joint Area, New Mexico; San Felipe/Santo Domingo Joint Area, New Mexico; and Other reservation lands in Montana.

In this report, "On reservations" includes all areas inside reservation boundaries; it excludes tribal trust lands outside the boundaries of reservations (which are shown separately) and all other off reservation areas. The category "Off reservation or tribal trust lands," as shown in table 2, includes the historic areas of Oklahoma (excluding urbanized areas), Alaska Native villages, and all other areas outside reservation and tribal trust land boundaries. (See definitions of these areas below.)

Data for 115 American Indian reservations were published in the 1970 census subject report, *American Indians*, PC(2)-1F. However, 1980 data for these reservations may not be comparable to 1970 information because of boundary changes, improvements in geographic identification, new enumeration techniques, and other procedural changes made for the 1980 census.

Tribal Trust Lands—Some American Indian reservations have tribal trust lands in the vicinity of the reservation. These areas were identified by the BIA for the 1980 census. The tribal trust lands approximate the tribal trust land boundaries provided by the BIA because the 1980 census boundaries were extended to the nearest physical feature for census purposes. The tribal trust lands, identified for the census, are located outside the

reservation boundary (off reservation) and are usually associated with a specific reservation. There were 36 reservations with tribal trust lands. In addition, there was one tribal trust land area not belonging to one specific reservation—Minnesota Chippewa Tribal Trust Lands—identified for the census. The Minnesota Chippewa Tribal Trust Lands include land of the Minnesota Chippewa Tribes' member bands of Bois Forte, Fond du Lac, Grand Portage, Leech Lake, Mille Lacs, and White Earth.

"On Tribal Trust Lands" includes all areas inside tribal trust lands located off reservation. Tribal trust lands (off reservation) were not identified in previous censuses.

Historic Areas of Oklahoma (Excluding Urbanized Areas¹)—The historic areas of Oklahoma (excluding urbanized areas) consist of the former reservations which had legally established boundaries during the period 1900–1907. These reservations were dissolved during the two-to-three year period preceding the statehood of Oklahoma in 1907. The former reservation boundaries are used for planning purposes by tribes and the Federal government. In the census, the entire area encompassing the former reservations was identified (excluding urbanized areas); individual former reservations were not identified separately. The historic areas of Oklahoma (excluding urbanized areas) were not identified in previous censuses.

Alaska Native Villages—Alaska Native villages constitute tribes, bands, clans, groups, villages, communities, or associations in Alaska which were listed in Sections 11 and 16 of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act, Public Law 92-203, or which met the requirements

of the act, and which the Secretary of the Interior determined were, on the 1970 census enumeration date (April 1), composed of 25 or more Alaska Natives. This list was reviewed and updated for the Census Bureau by the State of Alaska prior to the 1980 census to identify specifically only those entities that were recognized legally as Alaska Native villages. For the 1980 census, 209 Alaska Native villages were identified.

"In Alaska Native villages" includes all areas inside villages and "Outside Alaska Native villages" consists of all areas outside villages, excluding the one reservation in the State—Annette Islands Reserve. Data on Alaska Native villages are not available from previous censuses. Some cities and "unincorporated places" (referred to as "census designated places" in 1980) which were identified in the 1970 census may, however, approximate the 1980 Alaska Native villages but may not have identical boundaries.

Alaska Native Regional Corporations—An Alaska Native Regional Corporation is a corporate entity organized "to conduct business for profit," pursuant to the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act, P.L. 92-203, as amended by P.L. 94-204, and it consists of a portion of the State of Alaska composed, as far as practicable, of Alaska Natives with a common heritage and common interest. The boundaries of these "regions" have been legally established by the Secretary of the Interior in coordination with Native Alaskans.

The 12 regional corporations geographically include all parts of the State except Annette Islands Reserve. Each regional corporation has a corresponding nonprofit entity. A 13th region was established for Alaska Natives who were not permanent residents and who chose not to enroll in one of the 12 regions; no census data are presented for the 13th region.

OTHER POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS

Household—A household includes all persons who occupy a housing unit. A housing unit is a house, an apartment, a group of rooms, or a single room occupied as separate living quarters, or if vacant, intended for occupancy

as a separate living quarters. Separate living quarters are those in which occupants live and eat separately from other persons in the building and have direct access from the outside of the building or through a common hall. The occupants may be a single family, one person living alone, two or more families living together, or any other group of related or unrelated persons who share living arrangements.

Relationship to Householder—Two basic categories of relationship, householder and spouse, are recognized in tables 3, 5, and 6 of this report:

Householder—One person in each household is designated as the "householder." In most cases, this is the person, or one of the persons, in whose name the home is owned or rented and who is listed in column 1 of the census questionnaire. If there is no such person in the household, any adult household member could be designated as the "householder."

Spouse—A person married to and living with a householder. This category includes persons in formal marriages as well as persons in common-law marriages.

In this report, data are presented for households with an "American Indian householder or spouse" and "American Indian householder." The category "American Indian householder or spouse" includes all households where the householder or spouse is American Indian. "American Indian householder" includes only households where the householder is American Indian. In table 6, the data for Alaska are shown for the category "American Indian, Eskimo, or Aleut householder or spouse" which includes all households where the householder or spouse is American Indian, Eskimo, or Aleut and for the category "American Indian, Eskimo, or Aleut householder" which includes only households where the householder is American Indian, Eskimo, or Aleut.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

Housing Units—A housing unit is a house, an apartment, a group of rooms, or a

single room, occupied as separate living quarters or, if vacant, intended for occupancy as separate living quarters. Separate living quarters are those in which the occupants live and eat separately from other persons in the building and which have direct access from the outside of the building or through a common hall.

Occupied Housing Units—A housing unit is classified as occupied if it is the usual place of residence of the person or group of persons living in it at the time of enumeration, or if the occupants are only temporarily absent; e.g., away on vacation. If all persons staying in the unit at the time of the census have their usual place of residence elsewhere, the unit is classified as vacant. A household includes all persons who occupy a housing unit as their usual place of residence. In this report, by definition, the count of occupied housing units is the same as the count of households.

OTHER 1980 CENSUS REPORTS ON AMERICAN INDIANS, ESKIMOS, AND ALEUTS

Other 1980 census reports showing complete-count census data for American Indian reservations and Alaska Native villages are *Characteristics of the Population, General Population Characteristics, PC80-1-B*, and *Characteristics of Housing Units, General Housing Characteristics, HC80-1-A*.

The statistics for some reservations and Alaska Native villages shown in this report differ from those published in *General Population Characteristics, PC80-1-B* series and *General Housing Characteristics, HC80-1-A* series. The data on reservations and Alaska Native villages presented in this report include corrections made after the final 1980 census tabulations were completed.² This is the first 1980 census report to present data on tribal trust lands, the historic areas of Oklahoma (excluding urbanized areas), and Alaska Native regional corporations.

Separate data on American Indians, Eskimos, and Aleuts cross-classified by age, sex, relationship, and marital status

also were published by State in *General Population Characteristics*, PC80-1-B series. The PC80-1-B reports were published for the United States and each State; data are shown for standard

consolidated statistical areas (SCSA's), standard metropolitan statistical areas (SMSA's), urbanized areas (UA's), counties, county subdivisions, places of 1,000 or more inhabitants, American

Indian reservations by county, and Alaska Native villages. Comparable housing data were also published in *General Housing Characteristics*, HC80-1-A series.

Limitations of the Data

The statistics for some reservations and Alaska Native villages in this report differ from those published in *General Population Characteristics*, PC80-1-B, and *General Housing Characteristics*, HC80-1-A, because this report includes corrections made after final 1980 census tabulations were completed. Such

corrections also have been made for two counties in the historic areas of Oklahoma (excluding urbanized areas). Data for the historic areas, however, have not been previously published in Census reports.

Corrections to the 1980 census counts made after the final census tabulations

were completed for reservations, the historic areas of Oklahoma (excluding urbanized areas) and Alaska Native villages, are shown in tables D, E, and F. The corrected counts and the uncorrected figures published in table 55 of *General Population Characteristics*, PC80-1-B series, are shown in these tables for

the total and American Indian or American Indian, Eskimo, and Aleut populations for these American Indian areas and Alaska Native villages. The corrections shown in these tables include all revisions as of December 1983.

In addition to the corrections, estimates are provided in table G for eight reservations and the Te-Moak Tribal Trust Lands where data were affected by nonsampling errors. An evaluation of the 1980 census data showed that the 100-percent counts of the total and/or American Indian populations were affected by nonsampling errors in some areas (i.e., human and mechanical error). Nonsampling errors may be introduced during each of the many extensive and complex operations used to collect and process census data. The Bureau of the Census attempted to control the sources of such error during the collection and processing operations. For example, the various field and computer operations undergo a number of quality control checks to ensure their accurate application. Work of enumerators was carefully monitored, field staff were prepared for their tasks by using standardized training packages which include instructions in using census materials, etc. The successfulness of such procedures, however, was contingent upon how well the instructions were actually carried out during the census.

Table G presents American Indian estimates for Blackfeet Reservation, Santa Clara Pueblo, Santa Ynez Reservation, and Te-Moak Tribal Trust Lands based on related information from the 1980 census, the BIA, State governments, and tribes.

Table G also shows estimates for the total and American Indian populations for 3 reservations—Coushatta, Pine Creek, and Summit Lake—which are based on preliminary information from the Supplementary Questionnaire for American Indians (Reservations and Historic Areas of Oklahoma).¹ Although procedures

were to enumerate specified American Indian areas on both the regular census form and supplementary questionnaire, available information indicates that the American Indian population for

Miccosukee Reservation and Tigua Reservation was more completely enumerated on the supplementary questionnaire.

As a result of the corrections and estimates, the counts of American

Indians for some geographic areas (e.g., States, counties) differ from those published in the PC80-1-B and HC80-1-A series and other 1980 census reports.
