MESSAGE FROM THE NATIONAL PLANNER

This is the third in the series of Statistical Yearbooks for the Republic of Palau. The first two abstracts were published annually, in 1983 and 1984. Because this current yearbook is being published 8 years after the last one, we include data for the intervening years. In the 1993 Yearbook we will return to publishing data for the previous year only. Also, for various reasons, we are not able to present data from all the various Ministries. We intend to add information from these other Ministries as it becomes available to us.

The collection, compilation and publication of basic statistical time series has been the first priority for the Statistics Branch of our Office of Planning and Statistics. Most of the time series have been compiled in collaboration with National Government agencies and private enterprises, and their involvement, for which we are grateful, is indicated in the source below each table.

Although the coverage of the statistics presented in this issue is not complete, improvements have been made, when compared to the first two issues of the Abstracts of Statistics. We are also including expanded data from Health Services and Marine Resources. We are including tables from our recently completed Household Income and Expenditures Survey as well as many tables compiled from the recently released 1990 Census of Palau report.

We are certain that the statistical data in this issue will be helpful for many people, but still we welcome any comments or suggestions to improve the statistical series in preparation for future similar publications.

Mr. Huan F. Hosei of my staff was primarily responsible for assembling this statistical yearbook. He worked closely with Dr. Michael J. Levin, Population Division, U.S. Bureau of the Census. Dr. Levin was provided by agreement with the Office of Territorial Affairs, Department of Interior. OTIA also provided funding through grant PAL91-45 for Hosei to work with Levin in Washington, D.C. Dr. Larry Gorenflo also provided valuable assistance. Mrs. Francesca Sukuma of my office worked with early versions of many of the tables. Mrs. Emily Lennon made the graphs and many of the Census tables. I would like to express my sincere appreciation of the dedication and commitment of all of these people.

CHAPTER 1

INTRODUCTION

The inauguration of the first Constitutional Government on January 1, 1981, marked the beginning of the new Republic of Palau which was previously known as the Palau District in the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands.

The Republic of Palau stretches from about 2 to 8 degrees North latitude and 131 to 135 degrees East longitude. It consists of about 200 islands, of which only 9 are inhabited. These are, from Northeast to Southwest: Kayangel, Babeldoab, Koror, Peleliu, Angaur, and the Southwest islands of Sonsorol, Pulo Anna, Hatohobei, and Helen's Reef. Most of the islands are of volcanic origin, but others are of raised limestone.

The administrative center of Palau is in the islands of Koror, 7.1 square miles where two-thirds of the population resides. Koror lies just south of Micronesia's second largest island, Babeldoab, which contains 153 square miles of undulating forests, grass lands, and mangrove tidelands.

This chapter describes the climatic condition in the Republic of Palau. The temperature ranges in the 80s degrees Fahrenheit, but the humidity is high. Palau is affected by the trade winds and monsoons. The wettest months are from July to October when the rains come almost daily from the southwest. We include the climatic conditions month by month for 1991 as well as some historical climatic conditions over the last few years. The monthly inches of rain and average monthly temperature assists visitors planning trips to Palau as well as local government and private sector workers with their own planning.

CHAPTER 2

POPULATION

The 1990 Census of Palau has given Palau the largest amount of data available from any census in our history. The data have only recently become available, and while the Office of Planning and Statistics is currently writing a census monograph based on the data from the 1990 census, we include many tables based on the 1990 census to assist planners and policy makers. These tables cover many demographic, social, and economic facets of life in the Republic of Palau.

We begin by presenting demographic information -- current population densities by state, age and sex distributions over time, numbers of densities of households, fertility, and marriage. Then we look at social data -- information by birthplace, ethnicity, and generational and lifetime migration, educational attainment and language use. Where possible, we look at earlier censuses to see population trends in Palau. We conclude with current population projections based on the 1990 census and vital statistics.

In 1990, 15,122 persons lived in Palau on 188 square miles of land, or about 80 persons per square mile. The median age for males in 1990 was 26.1 years and for females 25.1 years. About 89 percent of Palau's population were ethnically Palauan, and about 82 percent of the people living in the islands were born there. The 2,885 households had an average household size of 5.01 persons, and the average woman 15 years and over had 2.8 children.

In 1990, about 71 percent of Palau's adult population were high school graduates, and 10 percent were college graduates. About 82 percent of the people 5 years and over spoke Palauan at home, and of those, about 94 percent spoke Palauan more than English at home.

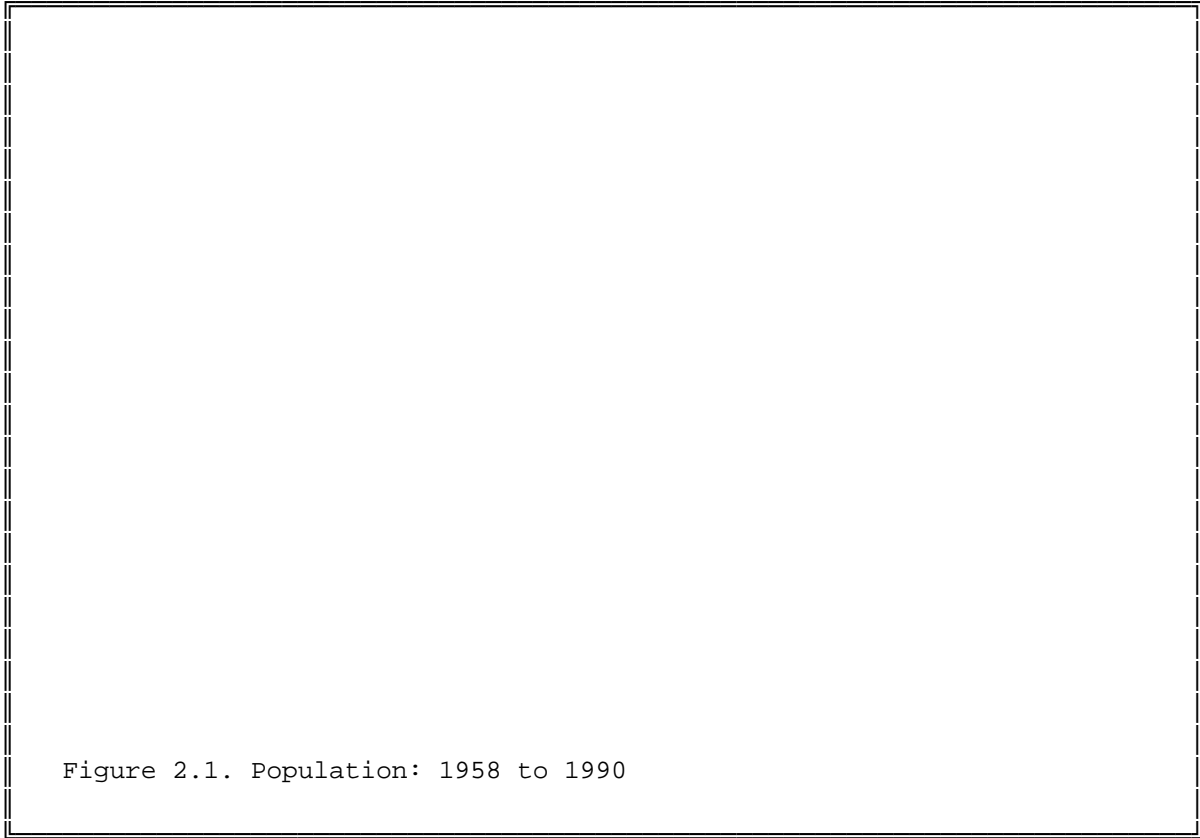
The Office of Planning and Statistics expects Palau's population to double between 1990 and 2020, with about 30,000 people living in the republic about 2020.

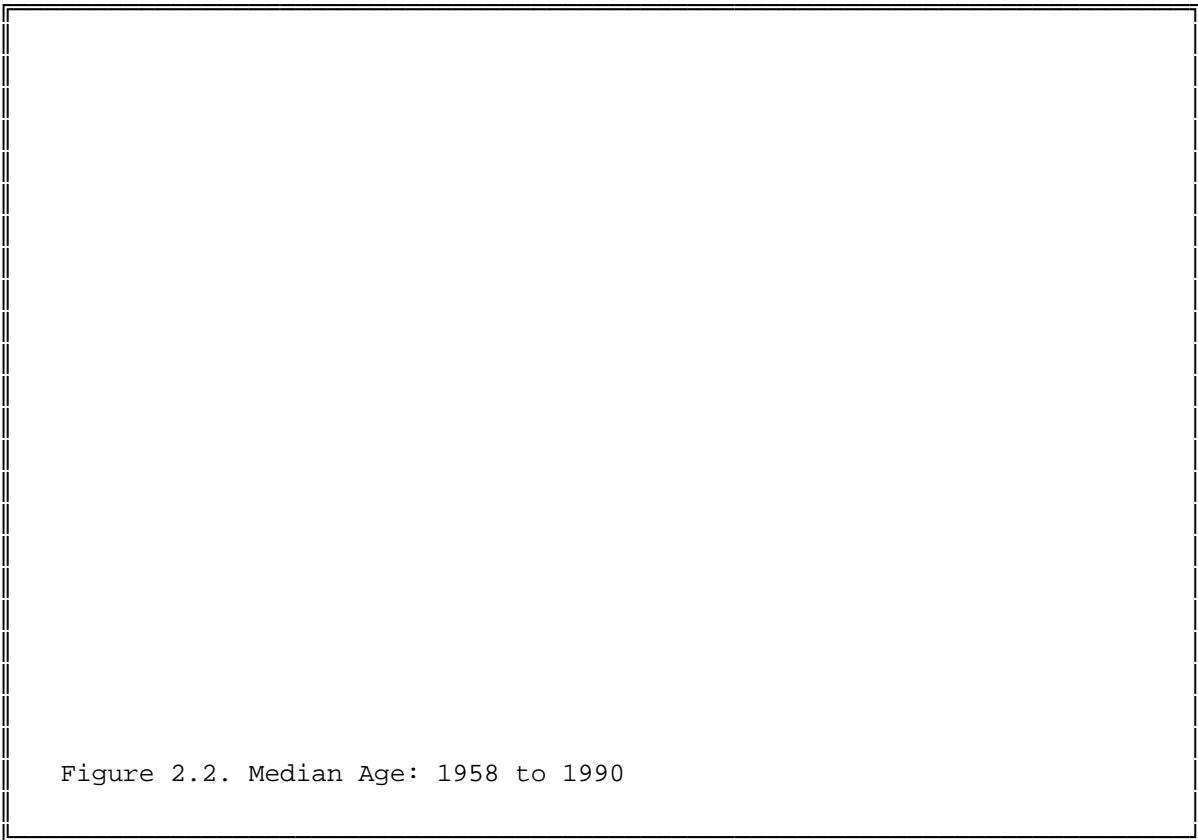

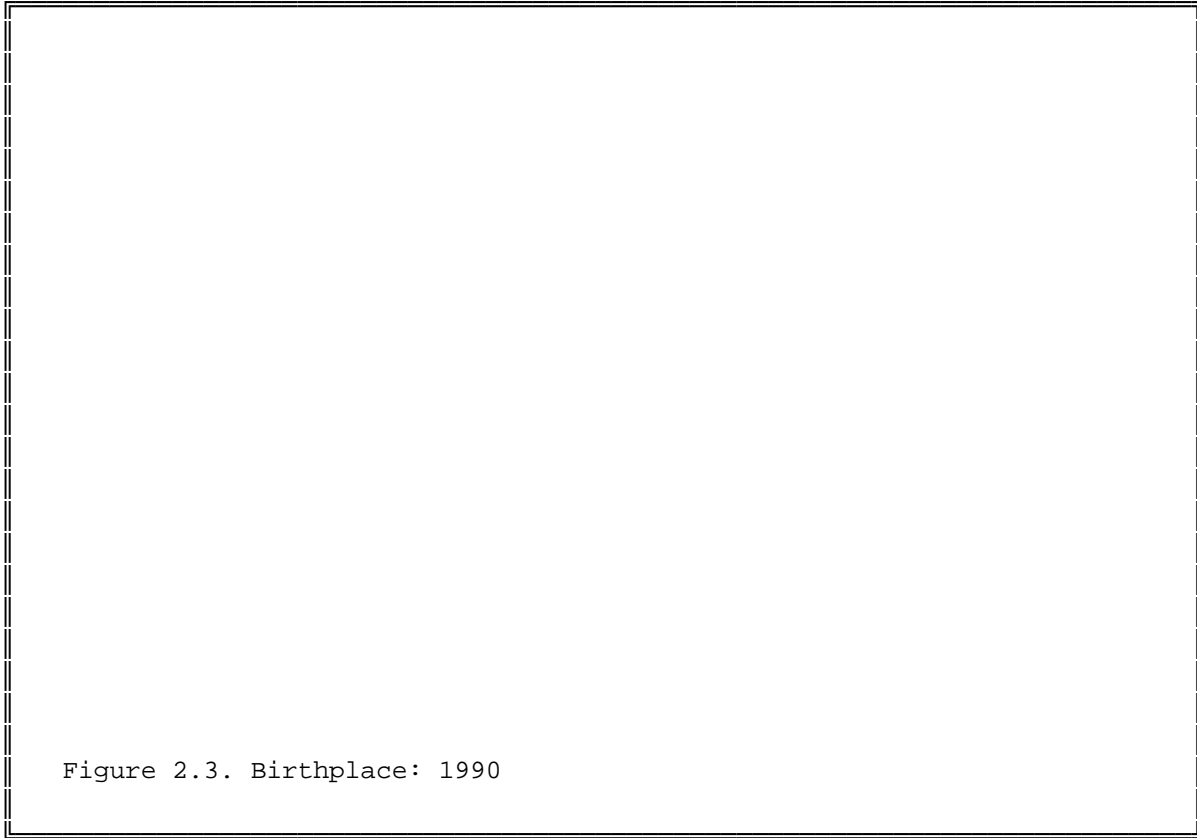

CHAPTER 3

HOUSING

This chapter presents housing information from the 1990 Census of Population and Housing for Palau. The 1990 Census presented more published information about housing conditions in Palau than any previous census. The 1990 Census information will be analyzed in the 1990 census monograph, but we are presenting tabular information here to assist in planning for Palau's current and future housing needs.

Here we look at tenure (whether people rent or own their house), materials used in the construction of the houses, rooms, bedrooms, plumbing conditions, sources of water, electricity, refrigerators, and vehicles.

In 1990, more than 3 out of every 4 houses in Palau were owned by the people living in them. The large majority of all the houses were single units, not connected to any other unit. The largest number of houses had metal walls, and metal roofs, on concrete foundations. Half of the houses had more than 4.2 rooms, about 40 percent had more than 2 bedrooms.

Only about 1 in every 3 houses had complete plumbing facilities in 1990 -- running water, a toilet, sink, and tub or shower. About 12 percent of the houses still had no piped water, but about 87 percent got their water from a public system. More than half the houses still did not have a flush toilet.

About 7 out of every 8 houses in 1990 had electricity and about 2 out of every 3 had a refrigerator, and more than 1 in 8 had an air conditioner. While less than half of all the households had no vehicle, more than 1 in 3 had one, and more than 1 in 8 had two or more.

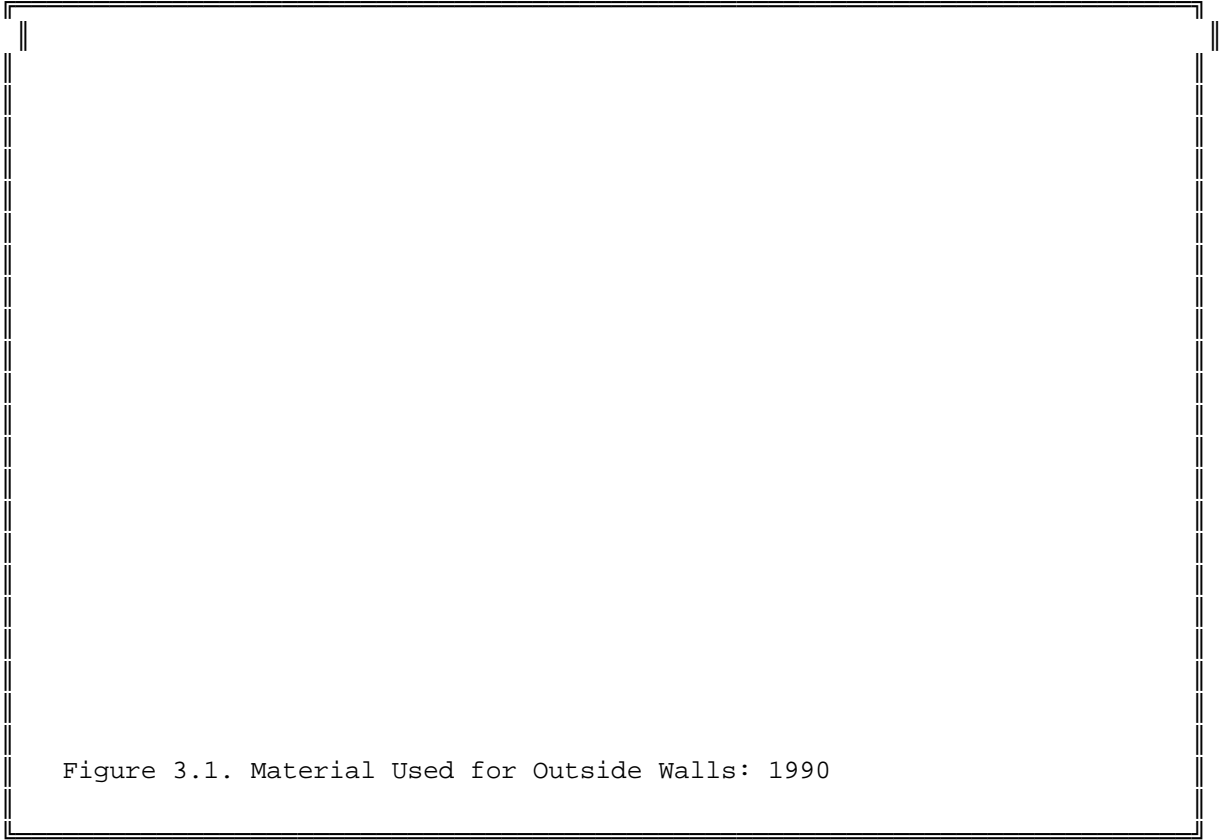




Figure 3.2. Materials for Roof: 1990

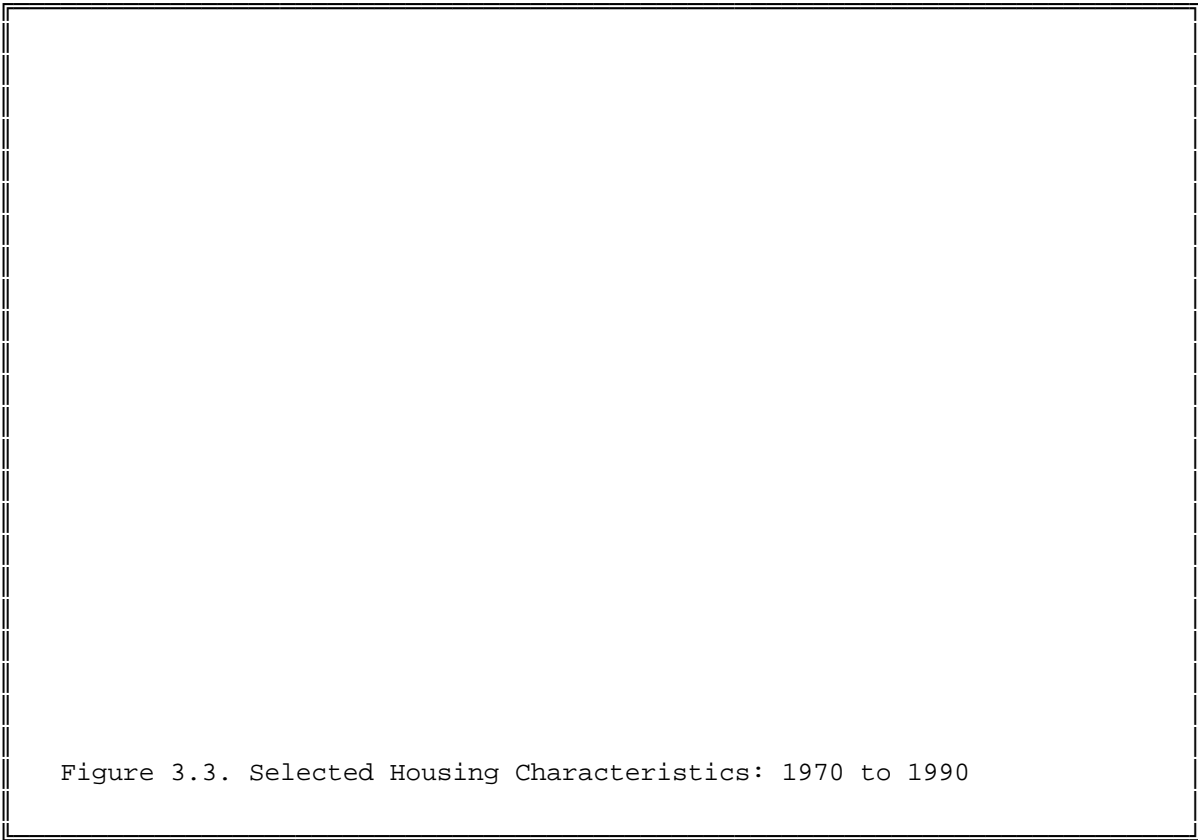

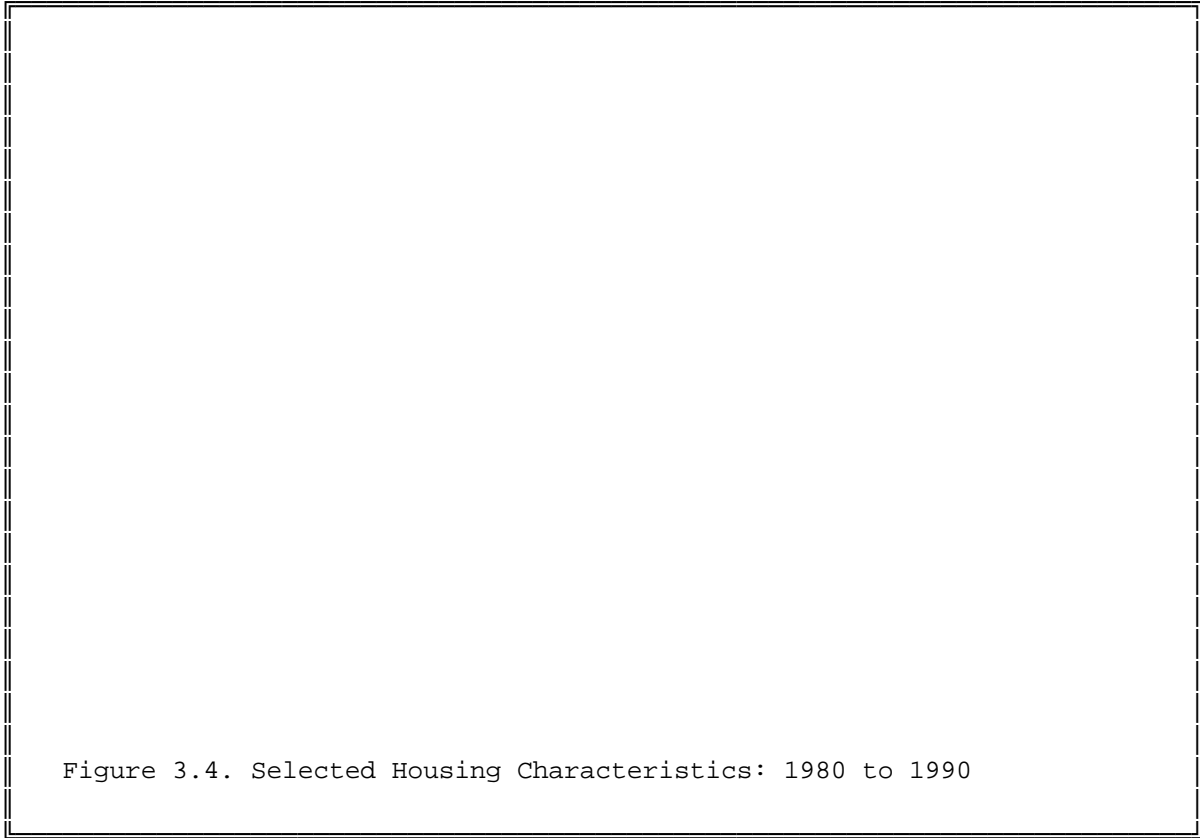

CHAPTER 4

EMPLOYMENT AND EARNINGS

This chapter shows tables on labor force participation in the week before the census in 1990, and for all of 1990. For those people who were working, we present tables on their occupations, the industries they were working in, and whether they were private or public sector employees. We present historical comparisons wherever possible. We are unable to show data from other sources in this volume -- distributions of government employees by age and sex and ministry for the public sector and age and sex and employer for the private sector -- but these data were not available for this volume. We will present data on these topics in the next statistical yearbook. Also, the Office of Planning and Statistics is currently involved in analyzing data collected for an economic census collected early in 1992. We will be presenting tables next year as part of the results of that survey.

In 1990, almost 6 out of every 10 adults were in the labor force, about 68 percent of the males, and 48 percent of the females. Young people were the most likely to be unemployed, middle aged people (those 35 to 44) the most likely to be in the labor force. While more than half of the adults born in Palau were in the labor force, this was true for 19 out of every 20 adults born in the Philippines. The more English the people spoke, the more likely they were to be in the labor force. Also, the more education they had, the more likely they were to be in the labor force.

Professionals in health and educational services made up the largest industry category in 1990, followed by construction and public administration. Males were more likely to be in construction, females in education. For the kinds of jobs people had, their occupations, managers and professionals also was the largest category in 1990. The second largest category was people in technical, sales, and administrative support. About 1 in every 4 males were in precision craft production (construction), while more than 1 in every 3 females were in technical, sales, and administrative support (and slightly less than 1 in 3 were in service occupations.) About 6 in every 10 adult workers were in the private sector, about 4 in 10 were in the government, about the reverse of 1980, showing the enormous growth in the public sector.

About 6 in every 10 adults worked at some time in 1989, with about 2/3rds of those workers working for 50 weeks or more. Almost everyone who worked, worked full-time (35 hours or more per week). A larger percentage of the adults born in the Philippines worked in 1989 than the native born Palauans. About 6 in every 10 houses had 2 or more workers in the house. The median income in 1990 was about \$8,000, meaning about half the households had incomes less this amount, half more. The mean, or average income, was \$12,000. About \$18 million was earned from home produced items, about half of that from fishing.

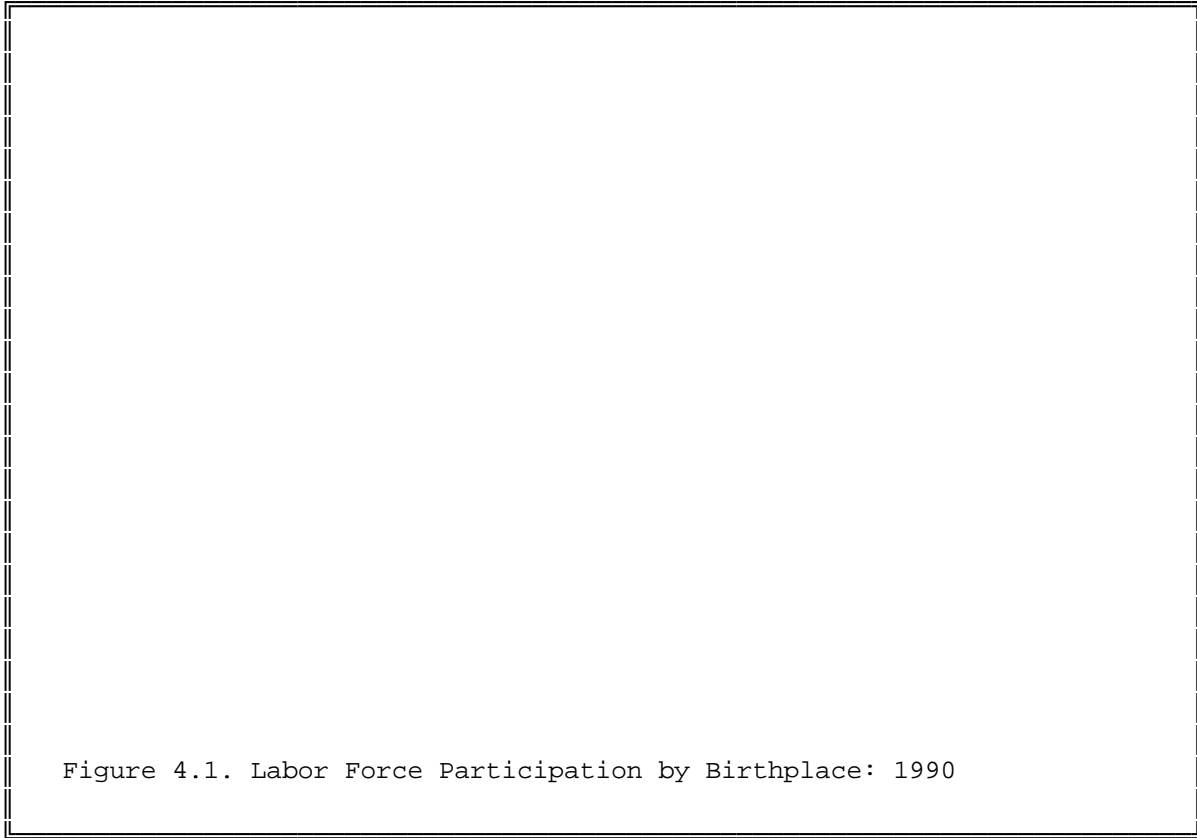

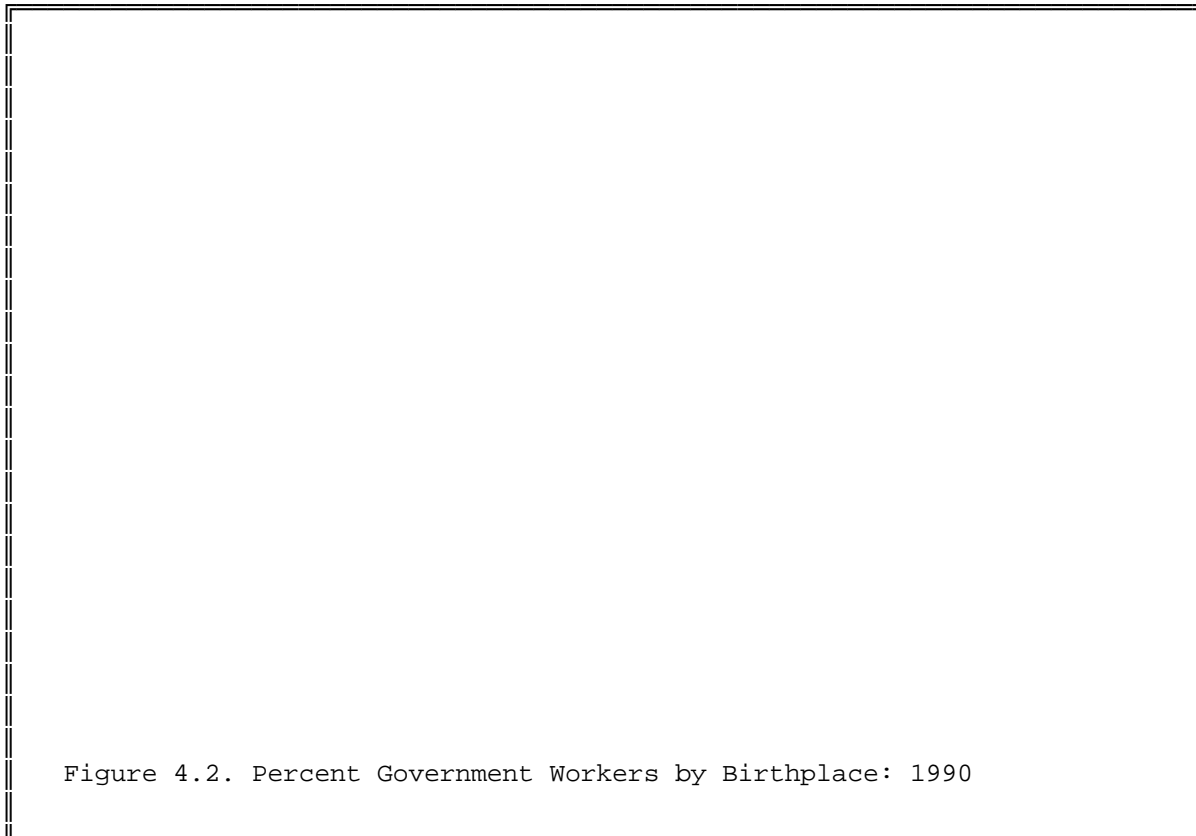

CHAPTER 5

AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES

Information on fish and fisheries are collected by the Ministry of Marine Resources and published annually in their own report. We repeat many of the most important tables from that publication to permit people trying to obtain a complete picture of the statistical situation in Palau to make use of those data, too. Also, in 1989 Palau took a partial survey of agricultural holdings in Palau. We will present summary tables from that survey in the next volume of the statistical yearbook.

The tables show trochus exports (257 metric tons in 1989), 3,267 reef fish, tuna, crab, and lobster landings in 1990, 132 fisherman taking 570 mangrove crab trips in 1991, and 128 men taking 300 lobster trips in 1991. The tables also show estimated landings of the most important fish from various agents, and export of sashimi, as well as visitors to the marine resources facility.

CHAPTER 7

NATIONAL GOVERNMENT FINANCE AND ACCOUNTS

The Office of Planning and Statistics is currently involved in tabulating data collected earlier this year in a census of business establishments in Palau. This United Nations funded activity will provide data from the private sector on commercial earnings and workers to be used with public sector data to assist in developing data for national accounts. Since we do not have these data yet, we are not presenting information on national accounts in this volume. We will be presenting data from the survey and for national government finance and accounts in the next volume in this series.

CHAPTER 8

TOURISM

Information of tourists and tourism is provided by the Palau Visitors Authority through the immigration information collected from all foreign entries into Palau. These data are keyed and tabulated by the authority. We are presenting summary information here.

Almost 33,000 visitors came to Palau in 1991, and increase of more than 9,000 in a single year. The largest number of visitors came from Japan (14,529), followed by the United States (6,411). About 3 out of every 4 visitors were tourists, the rest came for business or employment or "other".

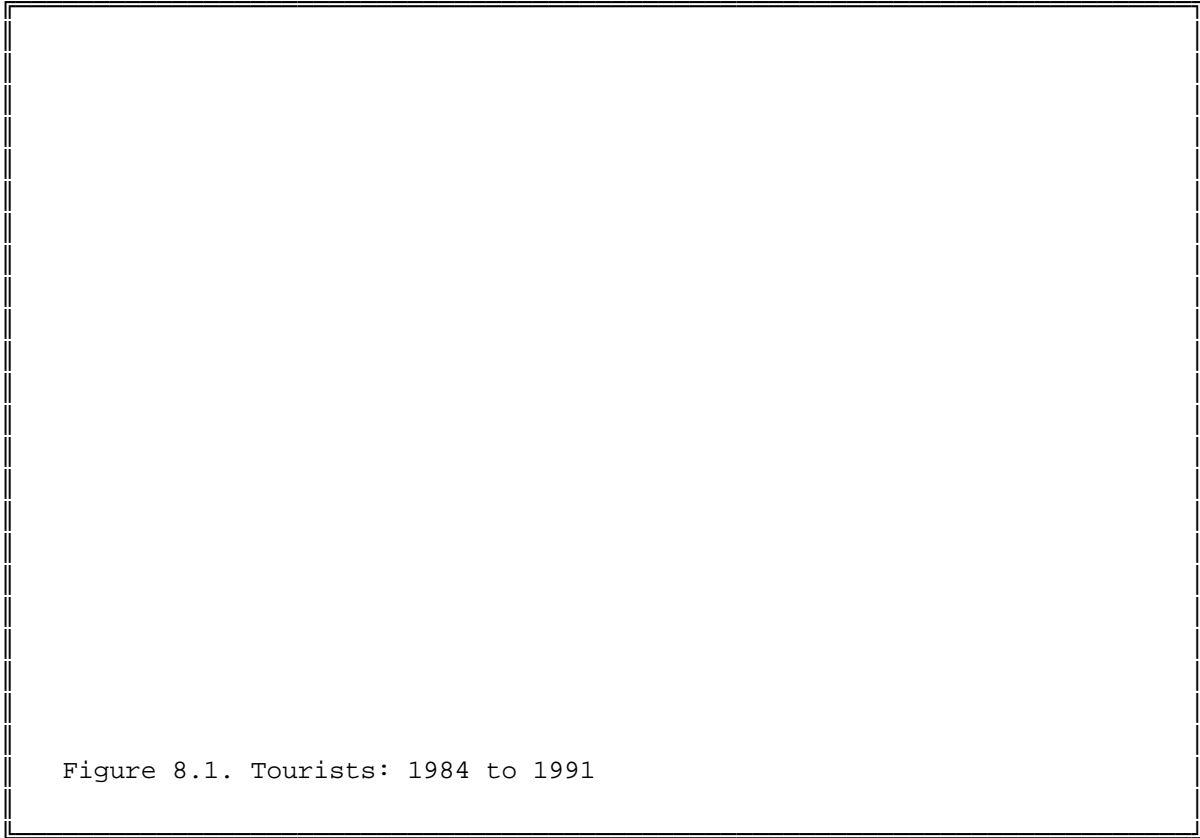

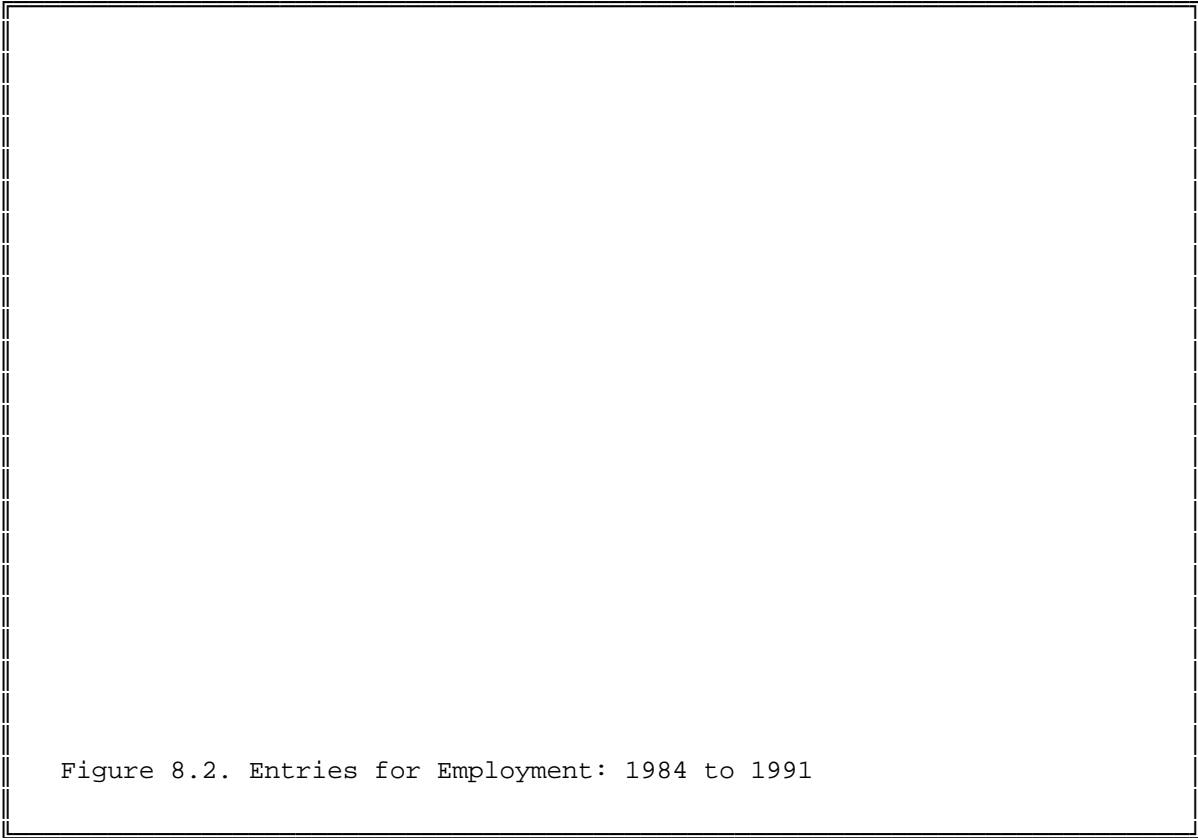

CHAPTER 9

EDUCATION AND LANGUAGE

Data on education and language come from three sources -- the 1990 Census of Palau (and earlier censuses), the Ministry of Education, and the Micronesian Occupational College (MOC). The Ministry of Education collects annual census data on the school populations, both public and private, students and teachers. He summarize data from their censuses here. The MOC collects data on its students each semester, and we present some of their summarized data as well. Finally, we present data from the 1990 Census of Palau on education and language.

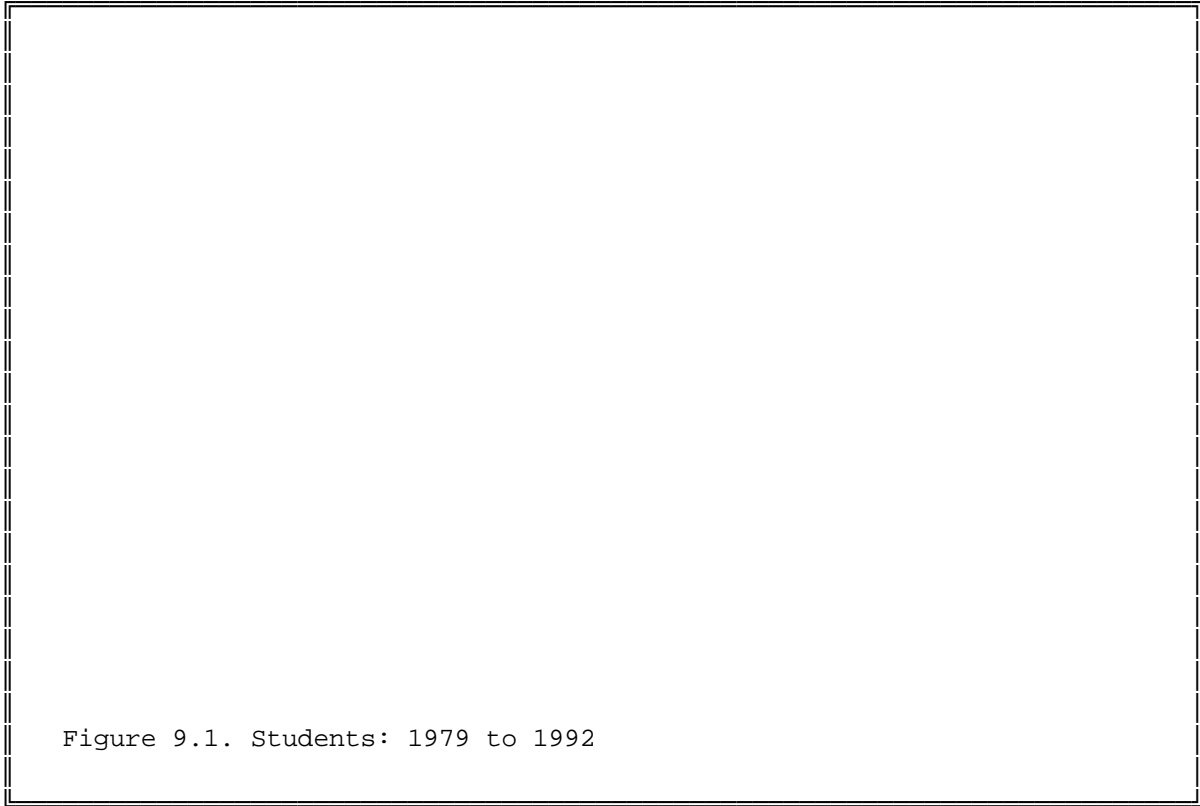
The 3,512 in the Republic's primary and secondary schools in 1991/92 showed a slight increase from the previous school year. Almost all of the increase was in the elementary schools, and most of that increase was in private schools. More males than females were in the elementary schools, but more females attended high school. The number of elementary school teachers decreased from the previous year.

MOC had 319 students enrolled during Spring, 1992, with 152 from Palau, 107 from the FSM and 59 from the Marshall Islands. The largest field of study was general office clerk, with 57 students.

The decennial census data showed an increase in school enrollment between 1970 and 1980, but a decrease between 1980 and 1990. The percent of high school and college graduates continued to increase over time. In 1990 58 percent of the adults were high school graduates, and 10 percent were college graduates.

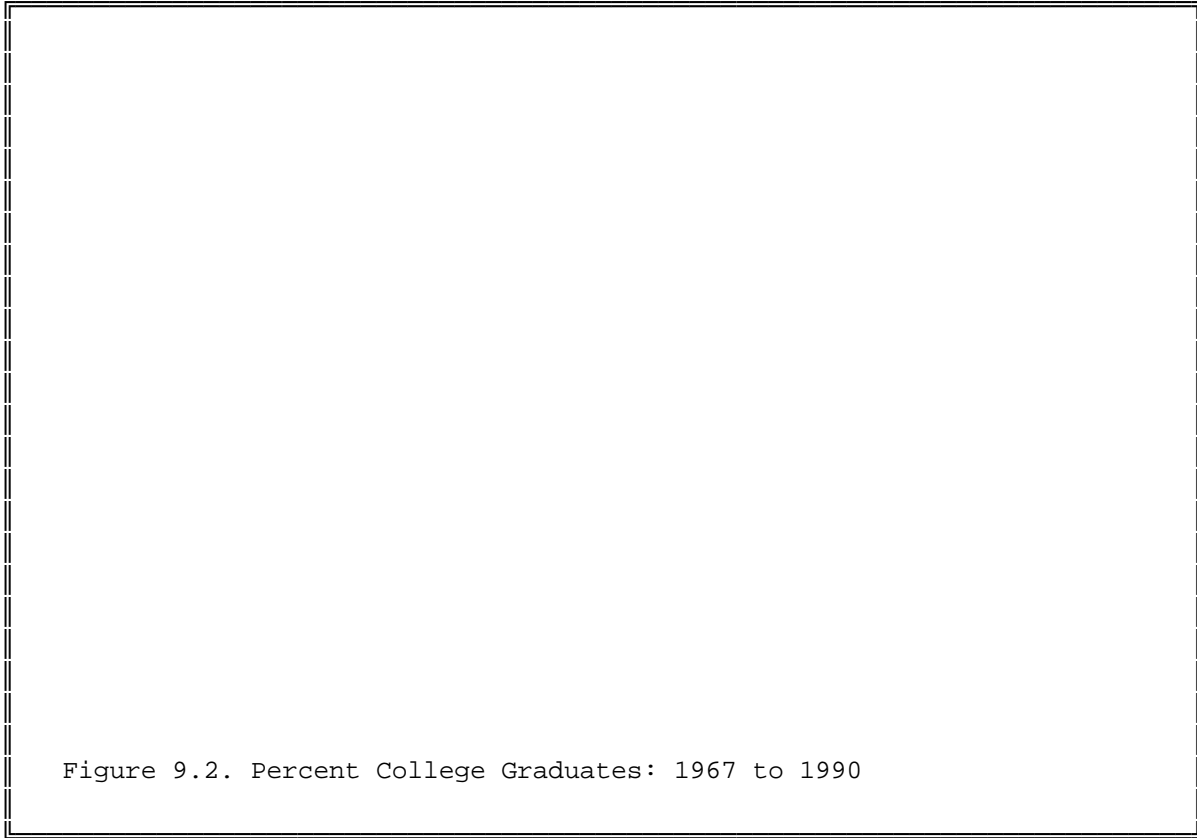

CHAPTER 10

HEALTH AND VITAL STATISTICS

Information on health and vital statistics is collected by the Medical Records Office, Ministry of Health Services. These data are collected continuously, and are summarized in annual reports. We presented selected tables from those reports.

Palau had 326 recorded births and 117 deaths in 1990. The crude birth rate of 22 per 1000 is very low by Pacific standards, as is the crude death rate of 8. Only 8 infants died before reaching their first birthday. More than half of the babies delivered in 1990 were by physician, most of the rest by medex or nurse.

The largest number of deaths in 1990 were from circulatory ailments, the second largest from respiratory system problems. The age specific death rates show the normal pattern, after infant deaths, few deaths until later ages.

The number of outpatient visits reached almost 23,000 in 1988, with respiratory diseases constituting more than 1 in every 5 visits. Influenza was the largest reported notifiable disease in 1990, with about 2 of every 3 reports.

In 1991, almost 80,000 long distance calls were made from the republic, an increase of about 13,000 calls in one year., total revenues from the National Communications Corporation were up considerably from the previous year.

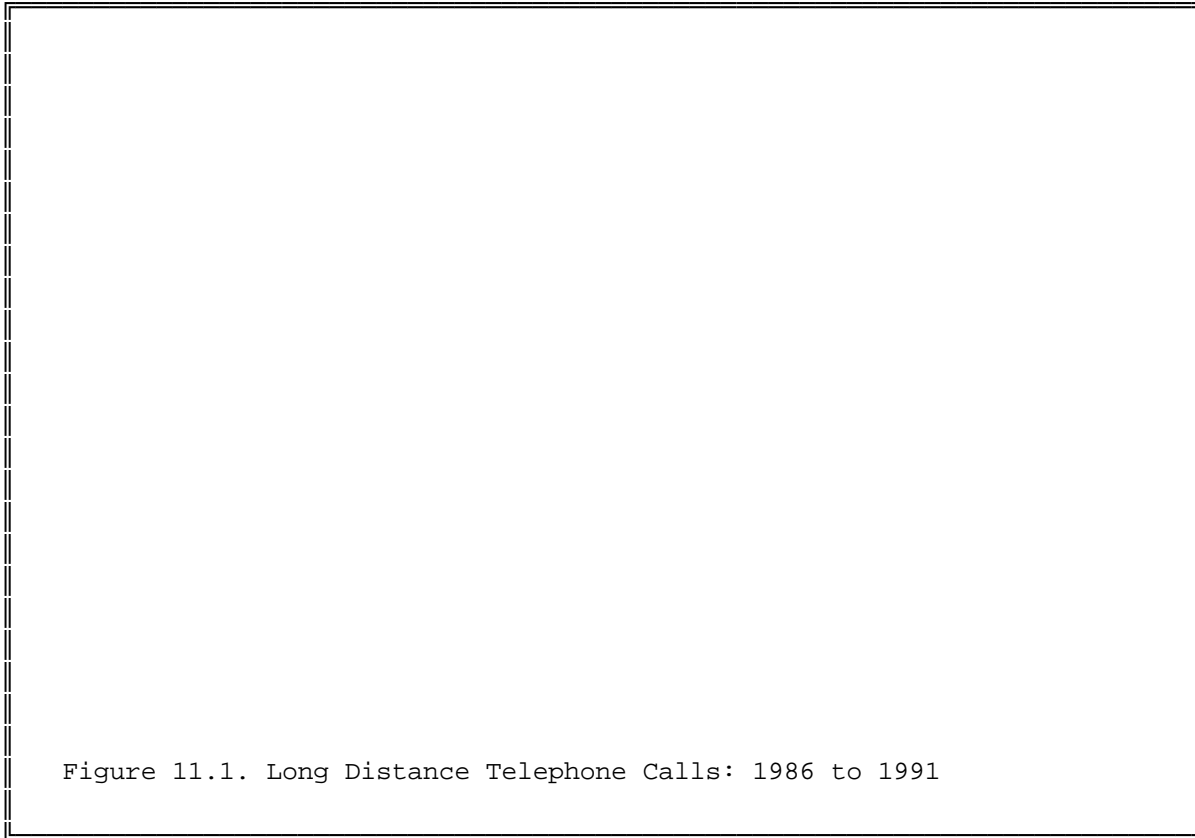

CHAPTER 12

CONSUMER EXPENDITURES

The Office of Planning and Statistics conducted a Household Income and Expenditures survey in 1991. Some of the results are presented here. We also present data from price surveys of restaurants and local market produce conducted by the Office of Planning and Statistics. OPS also collected data for imported commodities which are presented here.

Of the 566 households with regular expenses (96 percent of the total), the largest percentage paid for utilities, followed by school payments, and vehicle expenses, church donations, and housing costs. The largest per household expense was the \$1,900 each for loan payments and housing. Almost \$10 million was estimated to be spent by Palauans on regular expenses during the year. Palauans spend an estimated \$15 million per year on major expenses such as vehicles, electrical appliances, clothing, and overseas travel. More than \$3 million is spent on gifts.

About \$11 million is spent annually on food, based on a two week survey. Meat is the largest category, about \$3.6 million each year. About \$7 million more per year is spent on non-food items, with "Palau-oriented" purchases such as betel nut leading the list with almost \$2 million.

CHAPTER 13

PALAUANS INSIDE AND OUTSIDE PALAU

The U.S. Bureau of the Census collected 1990 Census data for the other U.S. territories and for the United States at the same time as the 1990 Census of Palau. In each of these areas, people born on Palau were identified separately. So, we are able to have tabulations for persons born on Palau but living in different places in April, 1990. In the tables we present here, we look at people born in Palau and living in either Palau, Guam, or the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI). It is important to remember that other Palauans live in other places. We can not know how many Palauans were living in places not connected to the 1990 Censuses -- for example, we cannot include Palauans living in the Federated States of Micronesia, or in the Marshall Islands, or in other countries. And, because the data from the 1990 Census of the United States are not yet available, we cannot include data from that census for Palauans living in Hawaii or on the U.S. mainland. We hope to include tables on those Palauans in the next volume of the statistical yearbook. Here, we look at Palauans at what seem to be the three largest areas -- Palau, Guam, and the CNMI.

While 12,575 people in Palau were born in Palau, another 1,858 persons born in Palau were living on Guam in 1990 and another 1,620 were living in the CNMI. The average age for Palau born living outside Palau was about 1 year older than those living in Palau. The median age for females living outside Palau was greater than for the males. In Palau, about 105 males were present for every 100 females, but outside Palau, females predominated -- only about 9 males were on Guam and in CNMI for every 10 females. Females both inside and outside have about the same number of children -- 2. Palauans on Guam were more likely than those in the CNMI to be citizens. The 1991 Household Income and Expenditures Survey showed that about 6 out of every 10 people in Palau had never left Palau. Of those who left, more than 1 in 3 went to Guam the last time they left, about 1 in 3 of all those you left went on vacation the last time they left, and most went away for less than one year.

The 1990 data showed that more than half of the Palauans in school on Guam were in college, but only about 1 in 7 of those in CNMI. While about 1/2 of the Palau born in Palau were high school graduates, about 2/3rds of those outside were in this category. Palauans on Guam and in the CNMI were more likely than those in Palau to be in the labor force, particularly in CNMI where many worked in the garment factories. On Guam, males were more likely than females to be in the labor force, but in CNMI, the two sexes were equally likely to be working. Similarly, Palauans outside were more likely to have worked in 1989. About 3 of every 10 Palauan workers in Palau had managerial and professional jobs in 1990 compared to only 3 in 20 of those outside Palau; conversely, Palauans outside were more likely to have service jobs. While half of the Palauans in Palau worked in the government, more than 3 out of every 4 living on Guam and CNMI were in the private sector.

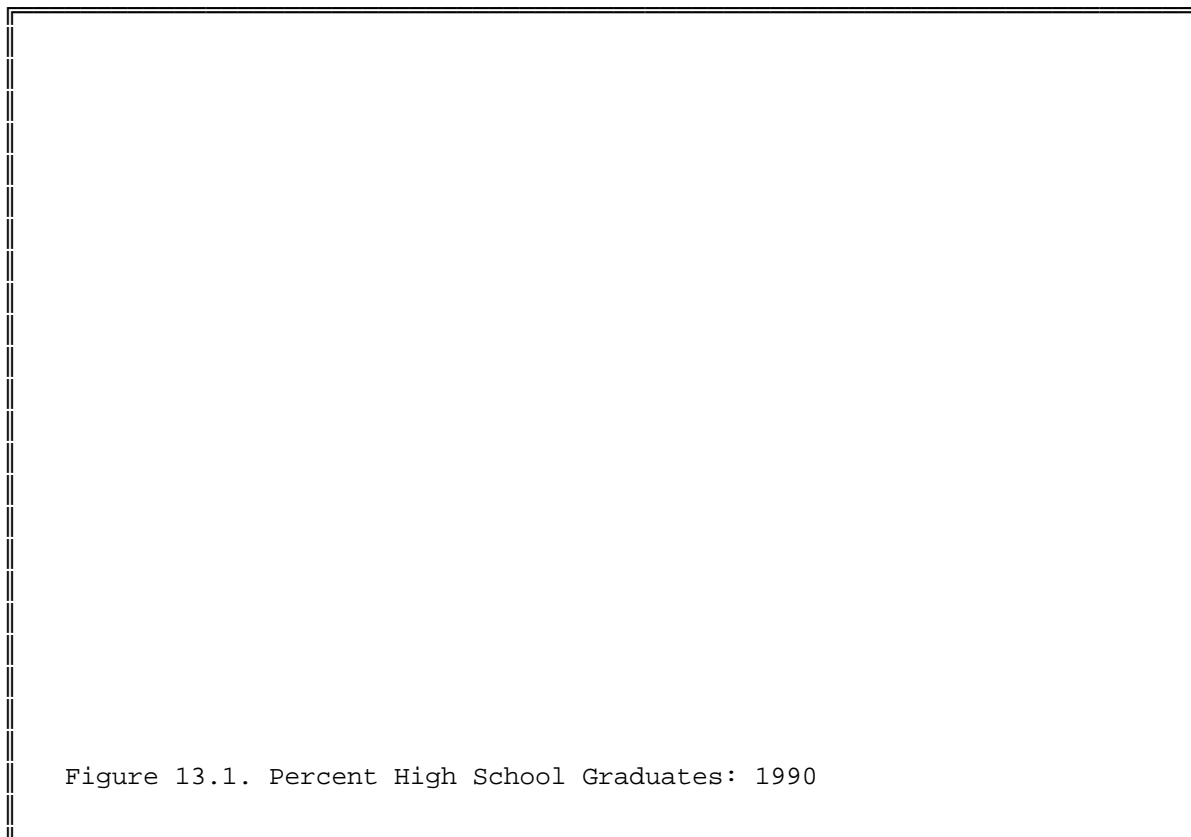




Figure 13.2. Percent in Labor Force: 1990

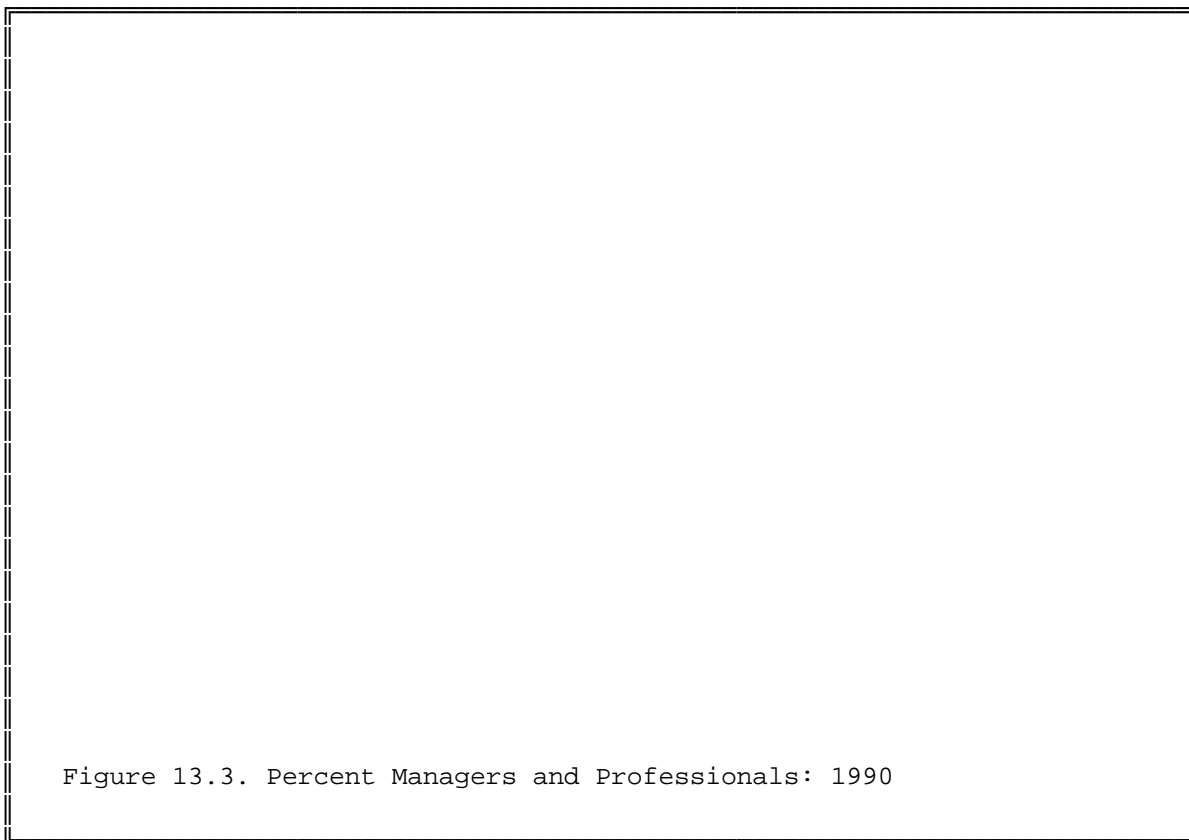

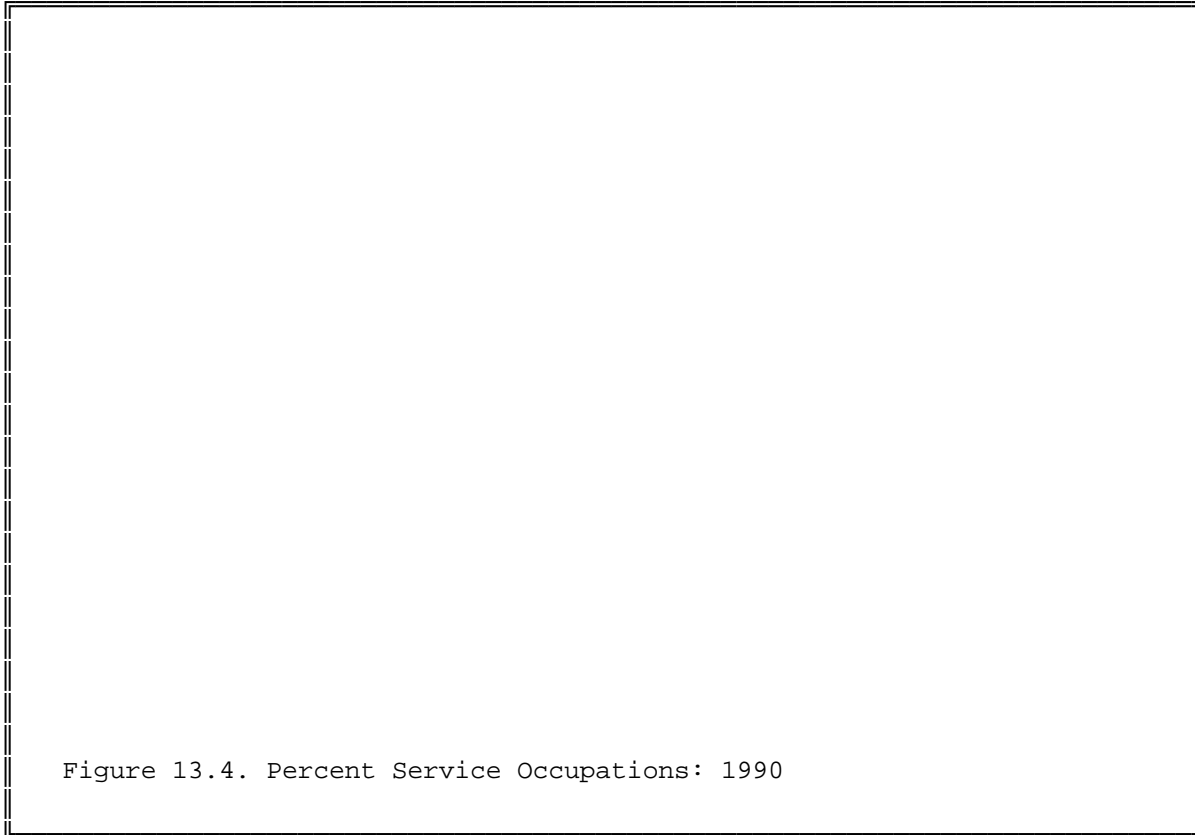

CHAPTER 14

MISCELLANEOUS

This last chapter has only one table this year -- the main characteristics of credit unions. As time goes by, we will be using this chapter to display information which does not completely fit the criteria for the other chapters.

The total assets in credit unions increased only slightly between 1984 and 1991. Different units were included in different years, so it is difficult to compare the assets and liabilities over time. The number of member decreased over the 7 years.

This is the last chapter in the current statistical yearbook. The data presented in this yearbook give a statistical snapshot of the Republic of Palau in 1992 (based on the 1991 data). Since this is the first statistical yearbook in some time, we have not tried to cover all topics, and we have left out several topics which are usually included in yearbooks. Still we hope these tables are useful to students, planners, and the general public in Palau.
