Chapter 14

Health and Vital Statistics

Summary of Health and Vital Statistics

This chapter presents health and vital statistics on registered births, registered deaths, population-physician ratio, public health services, crude birth rate, crude death rate, and infant mortality rate.

Crude Birth Rate (CBR) is the ratio of the number of births to the number of population in a particular year. It is expressed as number per one thousand population.

Crude Death Rate (CDR) is the ratio of the number of deaths to the number of population in a particular year. It is also expressed as number per one thousand population.

Infant Mortality Rate (IMR) is the ratio of the number of infant deaths under one year of age to the number of live births in a particular year. It is expressed as number per thousand live births.

Registered live births for 2003 was 312; CBR was 15.4; registered deaths was 136; CDR was 6.7; infant deaths was 6; IMR was 6.4; and 2 Fetal Deaths.

The number of patients admitted to the Belau National Hospital declined from 2,994 in 2002 to 2,841 in 2003.

The number of births in Palau increased during the first part of the 1990s, then decreased, and now seems to be increasing again. The crude birth rate of about 15 per 1000 population is very low by world standards, as is the death rate of about 7 per 1000. Palau has very few infant deaths, so a very low infant mortality rate.

Figure 14.1 Registered Live Births




Figure 14.2 Infant Deaths



Palau has few multiple births, about the world average.

Almost all births now occur at the hospital because of its easy access to most of the States and the excellent facilities.

Palau has recently seen a trend towards having midwives as attendants to births, particularly in 2001, 2002, and 2003.

Few teenagers or elderly women are currently having births. Almost all births occur during the 20s and 30s.

Figure 14.4 Hospital Admissions Statistics: 1999 - 2003


