Chapter 9

Foreign Trade

Summary of Foreign Trade

This chapter presents data on imports and exports. Imports is the major element in the economy of Palau. Imports are valued at *free on board (f.o.b)*. Total imports in 2001 was \$95,744,049 and went up to \$96,773,220 in 2002, an increase of \$1,029,171. In 2002, total imports by commodity shows that *Other Transportable goods* constituted the highest share of 35 percent; *Metal Products, Machinery and Equipment* constitue 31 percent. Total imports by the national government shows it decreased by \$2.2 million since 2001 while state government imports increased by \$1.3 million. About 43 percent of the total imports were from USA and 40 percent were from Asia.

Fish and Garment are the two main exports in Palau. Migratory fish exports decreased from 2,030,697 Killograms in 2001 to 1,323,146 Killograms in 2002. Garment values went up from \$8.5 million in 2001 50 \$33.6 million in 2002.

Total imports increased between 1999 and 2000 before decreasing by almost \$30 million in 2001, and remaining steady for 2002, at about \$97 million. The largest major category of imports was transportation goods (about \$34 million in 2002), followed by metal products, machinery, and equipment (about \$30 million), and food products (about \$28 million).
